SYNOPSIS

JABARI DREAMS OF FREEDOM is a play to save Black youth from living through fear. It tells the story of Jabari, a young Black boy from the South Side of Chicago who loves to paint. Through painting, he can escape the turbulent world around him. When a friend is hurt by police, Jabari is afraid to leave the house. With his Forever President Barack Obama as a guide, he dreams he meets children from the Civil Rights Era including Ruby Bridges, Claudette Colvin, and a 7-year-old Barack Obama on the eve of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Can Jabari use the lessons he's learned to instill in young Barack the ideas he'll need to become president? Will Jabari take these lessons back into his own life and heal his community? Using history, rap, freedom songs, and humor, this play explores what it means to have courage in a world where Black children—Black boys—are not safe.

DANIEL CARLTON (Director):

Daniel Carlton is a versatile storyteller and award-winning teaching artist. His work has been presented nationally and internationally in schools, jails, homeless shelters, libraries, and every imaginable place to perform (except for outer space). Playwright credits include: *March On*, based on interviews with attendees of the 1963 March on Washington; *Timeless Journeys*, a monologue series based on the history of free African Americans in Brooklyn, NY (commissioned by The Weeksville Heritage Society). Daniel's verse play *Pigfoot Mary Says Goodbye to the Harlem Renaissance* was produced by Metropolitan Playhouse and is one of the touring shows of The Negro Ensemble Company. Daniel directed the workshop production of *Night Train 57* at the Kennedy Center in D.C., and *Saying Something* at Columbia University's Miller Theater for "The While We Are Still Here" project. www.danielcarlton.com



NAMBI E. KELLEY (Playwright/Producer):

Award-winning playwright and actress Nambi E. Kelley was chosen by literary legend Toni Morrison to adapt her novel Jazz for the stage (Baltimore Center Stage, Marin Theatre Company). Nambi's adaptation of Richard Wright's Native Son has been seen across the country and premiered off-Broadway in 2019 at The Duke on 42nd Street (The Acting Company; AUDELCO Award for "Best Play"). Several others of Nambi's plays have had multiple regional productions including Xtigone (African-American Shakespeare Co.) and Hands Up: Seven Playwrights Seven Testaments: Dead of Night... (Alliance Theatre 2020). She has penned plays for Steppenwolf, Goodman Theatre, Lincoln Center (Director's Fest), and internationally. Nambi is a former playwright-in-residence at the National Black Theatre in New York and the Goodman Theatre in Chicago, and she recently served in residence at New Victory Theatre. She is the winner of this year's NNPN annual commission, the Prince Prize 2019, and a Dramatists Guild Foundation Writers Alliance Grant 2018-19. JOE PLUMMER (Musical Director):

Joe Plummer is a true renaissance man and has found a successful niche as a musical playwright. Get Ready, his premier production along with Jaye Stewart, has been produced by Victory Gardens Theatre (BTA award for "Best New Writing of a Play"; Jeff Award nomination), ETA Theatre (Jeff Award nomination for choreography), The Ensemble Theatre, and Penumbra Theatre. His musical I Got'cha: The Story Of Joe Tex And The Soul Clan at The Black Ensemble Theatre in Chicago garnered Joe and his co-writer David Barr III two Black Excellence Awards, and the New Horizon Theatre production in Pittsburgh took 11 Onyx Awards. Joe's third musical Nothing but the Blues was presented at the Black Ensemble Theatre (Jeff Award nomination; 10 Black Theatre Alliance Awards), New Horizon Theatre, and onboard Celebrity Cruise ship's Legendary Rhythm and Blues Cruise. Joe's next musical Vee Jay Records, co-written with Sanetta Gipson, had its first reading at The Chicago Dramatists. Current young audience commissions include: Hero: The Boy From Troy (Pittsburgh CLO, music by Joe Plummer) and This Ability (cowritten with Daniel Carlton, Chicago Children's Theatre). FWP's Founder Nambi E. Founded in 2005, the critically acclaimed Chicago Children's Theatre focuses on the production of first-rate children's theatre, with top writing, performing, and directorial talent and high-quality design and production expertise. In 2017, Chicago Children's Theatre became the first theater for young audiences in the nation to win a National Theatre Award from the American Theatre Wing, creators of the Tony Awards.
